# Lessons from Zeitouna

It's been more than 200 days since Hamas' horrendous attack on Israelis and the staggering carnage Israel has inflicted in response. Hostages have not returned home. Nearly 15,000 Palestinian children have been killed since the conflict began. And that number will only go up if the impending famine takes effect in northern Gaza in the coming days. Calls for relief aid, food, and a ceasefire are ringing in from across the globe. Most notably here in the United States are the protest and occupy movements happening on college campuses such as Yale, Columbia, and NYU. It's hard to keep track of all that is happening, especially when we have the privilege of changing the channel or to keep scrolling when the news becomes too much. For someone who's Jewish or Palestinian-American though, such a privilege isn't an option because this conflict impacts their reality in more ways than one.

I imagine all this terrifying news - the rise of international antisemitism, and the attacks on people who are of Palestinian descent - creates an overwhelming sense of fear: fear for oneself, their loved ones, and fear of the "other". Fear is really the most dangerous feeling we harbor. For out of fear comes hatred and dehumanizing and, eventually, violence. And perhaps worst of all, where there is fear, there is no love (1 John 4:18). What, if anything, can cast out this fear and move folks toward love?

According to the group, Zeitouna (which means 'olive tree' in Arabic), it takes a refusal to be enemies and a deep commitment to Dialogue. Zeitouna is a group of twelve women, six Jewish and six Palestinian, in Ann Arbor, Michigan who have been meeting together for over twenty years. The group gathers in each other's homes every other week, sharing dinner, and then engaging in facilitated conversations through a model called Dialogue. The goal of their conversations is not to formulate a response, but to understand the other's point of view, creating a shared understanding, rather than agreement, among people with very different perspectives.

Irene, a Jewish member, said "My heart has been opened to those who scare me." Wadad, a Palestinian member said, "It is only through Zeitouna that I am able to hear the voice of the 'other'- her pain and her joy - realizing that it mirrors my own." This is not a political group, but rather a model of coexistence and an example of how to move away from fear and toward love. I pray that their model spreads to college campuses, communities throughout the US and the world, and most of all in Palestine and Israel, where fear seems to be at an all-time high.

For this community, I hope we are inspired by their courage to respectfully, empathetically engage with people whom they feared and saw as 'other'. May the Holy Spirit strengthen us to do the same, moving us always away from fear and toward love.
